Since 2012 the Rift Valley Forum (formerly the Nairobi Forum) has been a leading space for critical exploration of political, economic, and social issues in Eastern and Central Africa. The Forum is a neutral venue for dispassionate examination of contested issues, where researchers, practitioners, officials and activists—from the region and beyond—meet on equal terms. The programme covers the Horn, East Africa, the Great Lakes, Sudan and South Sudan. Forum research and events are undertaken in collaboration with local and international partners, and supported by grants from governments, regional organizations and NGOs.



LECTURES, WORKSHOPS AND PUBLIC DIALOGUES

The Forum convenes meetings with public figures, academics, specialists and practitioners, where policy and practice confront research and local knowledge. Some Forum events are public; others are limited to invited participants. Lectures, workshops, public dialogues and conferences take place in Nairobi and in other locations, with local and international partners. Politics and Governance

Elections, political systems, constitutions, legal systems, institutional development and nation-building.

Contested Ground

Land conflicts, migration and mobility, urbanization and informal settlements.

Social and Political Inclusion

Rights and participation in politics and public life of women, youth, the poor, minorities and marginalized groups.

Economic Development

Emerging economies and livelihoods, extractive industries and infrastructure.

Conflict and Security

Armed conflict, political violence, extremism, crime and peace processes.

Development and Humanitarian Practice

Responses to humanitarian crises; effectiveness of humanitarian action.

Local Voices in the Arts

Visual arts, writing, performance and cultural conservation.
